Supporting affordable housing initiatives; lack of stable housing can contribute to financial instability and prevent individuals from accessing resources and opportunities, investing in affordable housing programs and rent control measures can help housing insecurity and reduce the risk of homelessness.

Improving access of Healthcare; the high coost of healthcare in the U.S in another significant barrier for those in poverty. Expanding medicaid covrage, reducing prescription drug price and ensuring access to preventive care can improve health outcomes and financial security for low-income individuals and families.

Raising the minimum wage and strengthen worker protection; the federal minimum wage of \$7.25 per hour has net up with rising cost income families to spend a disprortionate amount of their income on rent and leaving.

Addressing systematic issues that perpetuate poverty- fighting against discrimination and systematic racism, which disproportionately affect communities developing and creating opportunities for economic development in marginalized communities can help address the underlying cause of poverty.

Priotizing mental health and social support services; mental health can contribute to financial instability and prevent individuals from being able to access resources and opportunities. Providing access to mental health service and support networks can help individuals navigate the challenge of poverty and improve their overall wellbeing.

Fostering a culture of empathy and understanding towards those living in poverty is crucial in creating a more inclusive society. This can be achieved through education and awareness campaigns that challenge stereotypes and stigma associated with poverty and by promoting policies and initiatives that priotize the well - being of all individuals, regardless of their socioeconomic status.
